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1. General terms:

The interests clubs of the Riga Technical University Student Parliament (hereinafter referred to as the RTU SP) are called "RTU SP Interest Clubs".

- 1.1. RTU SP Interest Club (hereafter - Interest Clubs) aims to support RTU Students outside the study activity and to promote the intellectual growth of their members;
- 1.2. The founder of the Interest Club is an RTU student who studies or works at the time of foundation at RTU;
- 1.3. The head of an Interest Club can be any member of the club who is an RTU student, Employee or graduate;
- 1.4. A member of an Interest Club can be any person who wishes to improve himself Within the purpose of the Interest Club;
- 1.5. The activities of the Interest Club must be in accordance with the legislation of the Republic of Latvia [the Law on Higher Educational Institutions of the Republic of Latvia] and must not be aimed at provoking national, ethnic and racial hatred, nor may it be guided by political or commercial goals;
- 1.6. RTU SP must inform the Head of Interest Club about the changes to the RTU SP Rules of Interest Clubs.

2. Functions of Interest Clubs:

- 2.1. To promote RTU students outside the study activity and students' involvement in them;
- 2.2. To promote the increase of the competence level of the members of Interest Clubs.

3. Establishment and closure of Interest Clubs:

- 3.1. The establishment of an Interest Club can take place during the RTU academic year, in writing by submitting an application with the reference "RTU Student Parliament Interest Clubs" and "List of Members of RTU SP Interest Club" (Annexes 1, 2).
- 3.2. An Interest Club can be established if it has at least 3 members;
- 3.3. The application for registration must be submitted to the RTU Student Parliament office in Āzenes street 22, during working hours;
- 3.4. The Interest Club is approved by the decision of the board;
- 3.5. The Board of RTU Students Parliament has the right not to approve the Interest Club on the basis of 3.6. for the reasons referred to in paragraph 1;
- 3.6. The Interest Club can be liquidated by the decision of the board after the initiative of the club's founder, club member, RTU SP board or RTU SP general meeting:



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- 3.6.1. If it is run for political or commercial purposes;
- 3.6.2. If it does not work in accordance with the RTU regulatory enactments;
- 3.6.3. if other violations are found that do not correspond to the interests of RTU and RTU SP;
- 3.6.4. If it is aimed at causing national, ethnic or racial hatred.
- 3.7. The decision on the liquidation of the RTU SP Interest Club may be adopted at the RTU SP Board meeting upon receipt of the application.

4. Rights and obligations of the head of the Interest Club:

4.1. The Head of Interest Club has the following rights:

- 4.1.1. Apply for the Student Initiative Fund project call and apply for financial resources for the implementation of its projects, which is not in conflict with the RTU Student Initiative Fund Regulations;
- 4.1.2. Use RTU SP information channels:
 - 4.1.2.1. RTU SP home page <http://www.rtusp.lv>
 - 4.1.2.2. RTU SP information stands at the faculties and dorms;
 - 4.1.2.3. RTU SP regular emails for students

4.2. Obligations of Head of Interest Club:

- 4.2.1. Hold meetings of Interest Club members;
- 4.2.2. Submit to the Board of the RTU SP the list of members of the Interest Club (Annex 2) and the current year's description of the work and activity description in free form by 1 December of each year;
- 4.2.3. To promote the goals of the club;
- 4.2.4. To promote RTU students' involvement with the Interest Club outside of study activities;
- 4.2.5. Provide RTU students with information about the possibilities to engage in Interests club activities;
- 4.2.6. To coordinate the materials to be published and to inform RTU SP about the use of information channels;
- 4.2.7. To follow the RTU SP PR concept.
